About CSA

CSA International is a leader in the testing and certification of products sold in the U.S. and Canada. Our approval marks provide assurance that a product has been evaluated by a formal process involving examination, testing, and follow-up inspection, and that it complies with applicable U.S. and/or Canadian standards for safety or performance.

We are an ANSI, OSHA, NES, IAS/ICBO, IAPMO and SCC accredited certification organization, testing products to national standards.



CSA Marks



Blue Star mark

The Blue Star mark indicates compliance with U.S. standards for gas-fired products including applicable ANSI, IAPMO and ANSI/CSA standards.



Blue Flame mark

The CSA Blue Flame mark for gas appliances indicates certification to applicable Canadian standards.



CSA US mark

This mark indicates that a product meets U.S. standards including applicable UL, ANSI, IAPMO and NSF/ANSI standards.

Our marks are accepted throughout the U.S. and Canada and appear on over one billion products. When you see a mark issued by CSA, it's your assurance that the product meets applicable U.S. and/or Canadian standards for performance or safety.



CSA C US mark

This mark is found on products that meet U.S. and Canadian standards, including applicable CSA, UL, ANSI, IAPMO and NSF/ANSI standards.



CSA mark

The CSA mark may appear alone or with indicators. If it appears alone, it means that the product is certified for the Canadian market, to the applicable Canadian standards.



Accreditation

CSA International is accredited by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) and the Occupational Safety & Health Administration (OSHA) as a testing and certification organization. We are also accredited by other leading independent organizations to test and certify gas-fired products and accessories for the U.S.

Combating Counterfeiting

The integrity of our marks is vitally important to CSA International and the many regulators, specifiers, product manufacturers, retailers, and consumers who trust our marks. Counterfeit product approval marks expose consumers to the risks of unsafe or untested products, while undermining their confidence in legitimate products.

CSA International maintains an aggressive, “Zero Tolerance” program to detect, expose, and take any necessary action against the unauthorized use of its approval marks.

Product recalls are initiated and coordinated by CSA International's Audits & Investigations (A&I) team. In cooperation with manufacturers, the A&I team investigates incidents involving CSA certified products, and issues all-points bulletins, product recall notices and safety notices as necessary.

The legitimacy of a product bearing the CSA mark can be confirmed by comparing the product's identification information against the certification record found on our website at <http://directories.csa-international.org>.

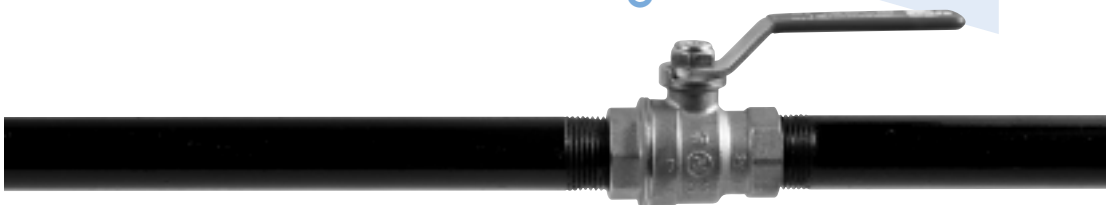
